




## Tulip class

And it was great making a big colourful mess for Holi.






# Saffron Class

# Should I keep my child off school?



## Yes

### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek

It is hugely important that your child arrives to school **on time** every morning. Being late means that your child misses out on education and also it is disruptive for others in their class.

Parents and carers **MUST** also make sure that they collect their child on time at the end of the day. Our staff need this time to prepare your child's learning for the next day and late collection also delays our staff from leaving on time.

## Parking

- Little Oaks families **MUST** use the one way system in the car park to exit the school. Exiting via Bridge Road is not only dangerous but also causes difficulties for other vehicles trying to enter the school.
- The entrance to the main car park will not be opened when students are being taken to or from buses. Families will be expected to wait until it is deemed safe to open the gates.
- Families of students in Y1—Y5 are expected to park on nearby roads and walk their child into school via the pedestrian entrance; unless driving into the car park has been agreed with the school.
