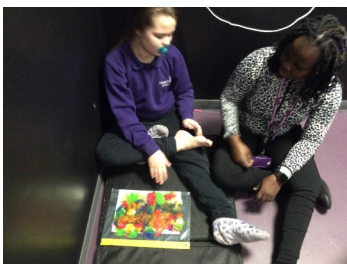

Our School Day

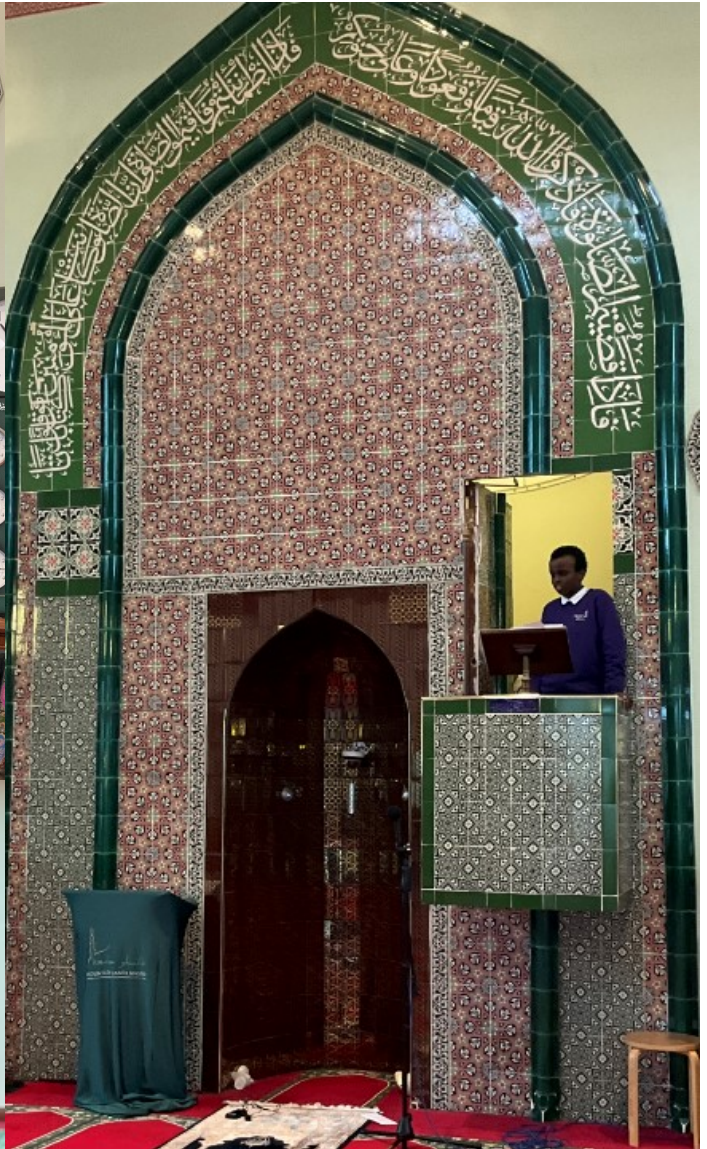

Minutes late per day during the school year	Teaching days lost over a year
5 minutes	Over 3 days
10 minutes	Nearly 7 days
15 minutes	Over 10 days
20 minutes	Nearly two weeks
30 minutes	Nearly three weeks

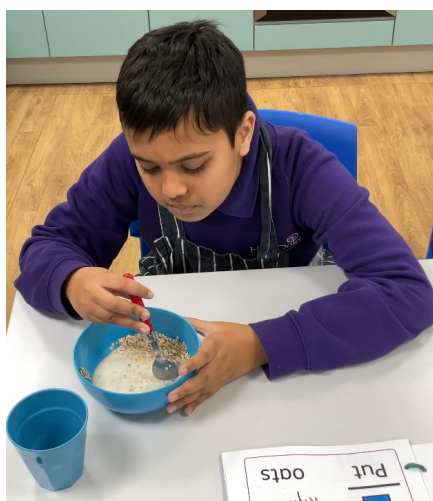
